Why Study at Portland State University (PSU)?

Portland State University is located in the heart of the city and prides itself in its sustainability efforts. Students who study in the short-term program will learn about PSU's met sustainability goals, which include:

- 14 LEED certified buildings
- 5 Roof gardens
- 10 bicycle garages for PSU students, faculty and staff
- Vegetable gardens and orchards that serve not only for educational purposes but also produce food for the food pantry where students can get free food.
- Rainwater drainage/usage systems
- Bike Hub: a place where PSU members can repair their bikes and purchase parts
- Planting of native plants and trees to lower maintenance, to cool the campus in the summer and to filter rainwater in the winter

Program Description:

Classes will be built around Sustainability and Service Learning. Each class will focus on developing students' listening, speaking, reading, writing, and vocabulary skills with a focus on one of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), while also increasing their understanding of American culture. Classes are communicative in approach and student-centered in its delivery. Students will have ample opportunity to explore cultural topics and expand their English language skills through small group activities, projects, and interaction outside the classroom in the Portland State and greater Portland communities.

Students will be in class for 16-17 instruction hours and 3-4 service learning hours Monday through Thursday, totaling 20 hours per week and **60 hours total** for the program. Fridays and Saturdays are filled with fun activities. The **sample calendar** gives an idea what the program might look like next summer.

Extracurricular activities:

Our extracurricular activities are facilitated by our well-trained program assistants who are current or former PSU students and include:

- Attending weekly international coffee hour to chat with other PSU students
- Visiting scenic places like Multnomah Falls or the Oregon Coast
- Going to the outlet mall for tax-free shopping
- Participating in a downtown Portland walking tour
- Experiencing Portland Food Culture (Blue Star and Voodoo Donuts, Salt & Straw ice-cream, Stumptown Coffee, and food carts from around the world)
- Visiting the Oregon Historical Society
- Visiting other popular Portland places like Saturday Market, the Farmer's Market, Powell's Bookstore, coffee shops, etc.
- Watching movies in the PSU theater

Housing:

The program fee includes dorm stay for 21 nights. If students stay an additional night, we can extend it and students can cover the cost using their credit card. Our students generally stay in the Broadway Hall dorms, unless they have made alternate plans. All students are required to share a room with a peer or pay full price for the room. Our short-term programs do not include meals. ISP provides cookware to students to allow them to prepare their own meals in the small kitchenettes that are part of the dorm rooms. Students can also buy meals from food carts, which Portland is famous for (Please refer to the separate handout).

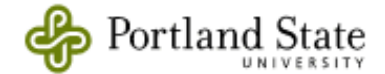
Arrival & Departure:

The program fee does not include airport transportation. If students would like to be picked up or dropped off, it's an additional \$75 each way. Students can book airport transportation directly with us by paying for the service online. If it's a larger group from one partner coming on the same flight, we can book a shuttle bus and include the airport transportation fee in the invoice.

If students arrive after 9 pm, we request that students book themselves a night at a hotel and check into the dorms the next day. If they depart prior to 9 am, we request that they book themselves a hotel near the airport for their last night. There are a number of hotels that provide free airport shuttle services at all hours of the day. We can recommend some hotels if needed.

Summer 2023 Intensive English Communication Program

Duration: **4 weeks**

Tentative program dates: August 7 - August 31, 2023

Program Price: \$3,650 (including dorms) - NO HOMESTAY AVAILABLE!

Why Study at Portland State University (PSU)?

Portland State University is located in the heart of the city and prides itself in its sustainability efforts and its diverse student population. Portland's motto is "Keep Portland Weird", which students will explore further in this class. Portland also provides a perfect environment to explore social justice issues with its growing population of houseless people. Houselessness is very prevalent in all West Coast cities and for some foreign cultures is a new concept. Students get an opportunity to look deeper into the root causes of this issue.

Program Description:

Classes are built around American Culture and will focus on developing students' oral communication skills, fluency, and confidence. Classes are communicative in approach and student-centered in its delivery. Students will have ample opportunity to explore cultural topics and expand their English language skills through small group activities, projects and interaction outside the classroom in the PSU and greater Portland community. This program is a more intensive program where students at a higher English level will explore social justice, gender identity, and equality issues. All students will be introduced to PSU's sustainability efforts and will participate in a couple of volunteer activities.

Students will participate in 16 hours of classroom instruction and 4 hours of small group conversation partner sessions, Monday through Thursday, totaling 20 hours per week and **80 hours total** for the program. The small group conversation partner sessions are facilitated by PSU students and provide students an opportunity to practice their English in a smaller setting. Fridays and Saturdays are filled with fun activities. The [sample calendar](#) gives an idea what the program might look like next summer.

Extracurricular activities:

Our extracurricular activities are facilitated by our well-trained program assistants who are current or former PSU students and include:

- Attending weekly international coffee hour to chat with other PSU students
- Visiting scenic places like Multnomah Falls or the Oregon Coast
- Going to the outlet mall for tax-free shopping
- Participating in a downtown Portland walking tour
- Experiencing Portland Food Culture (Blue Star and Voodoo Donuts, Salt & Straw ice-cream, Stumptown Coffee, and food carts from around the world)
- Visiting the Oregon Historical Society

Duration: **3.5 weeks**

Why Study at Portland State University (PSU)?

PSU is located in downtown Portland, Oregon in the heart of the city of roses (one of Portland's many nicknames!). Portland is a beautiful, clean, and safe place to study and experience American culture and university life. Portland is a popular tourist destination because of its walkability, many restaurants and parks, and the fact that it is tax free for shopping and other activities!

Program Description:

All students will participate in an English Communication class each day and then move to a content focused class of their choice. The general focus of our teachers is helping students practice their English conversation skills so they are prepared for future travel, study abroad, or talk with international visitors and colleagues. Classes focus on skills like fluent pronunciation and how to have natural conversation flow rather than focusing on grammar or writing rules.

Students will participate in 20 hours per week (on average) of class time including "field studies" or excursions with their content class instructor each week. Content classes may rotate depending on partner interest and teacher availability but currently include American Business and Portland Pop Culture. 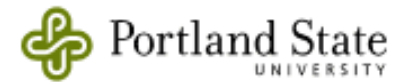

Summer 2023 American Conversation & Culture Program



Duration: **3 weeks**

Tentative program dates: August 14 - September 1, 2023 (DORM STAY ONLY)

Approximate price including dorms: \$2,550

Why Study at Portland State University (PSU)?

PSU is located in downtown Portland, Oregon in the heart of the city of roses (one of Portland's many nicknames!). Portland is a beautiful, clean, and safe place to study and experience American culture and university life. Portland is a popular tourist destination because of its walkability, many restaurants and parks, and the fact that it is tax free for shopping and other activities!

Program Description:

All students will participate in an English Communication class each day. The general focus of our teachers is helping students practice their English conversation skills so they are prepared for future travel, study abroad, or talk with international visitors and colleagues. Classes focus on skills like fluent pronunciation and how to have natural conversation flow rather than focusing on grammar or writing rules. American culture topics, like food, music, keep Portland weird, etc. will be included in everyday instruction.

Students will participate in 12.5 hours per week (on average) of class time. In addition, students will practice their English in small group conversation partner sessions with a fluent English speaker, most likely a PSU student. With the additional 4 hours per week of conversation time, students will receive a total of 16.5 hours of focused instruction and English conversation time per week and ~ 50 hours total over the program duration. 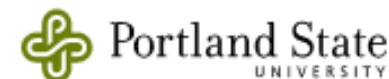
Meals:

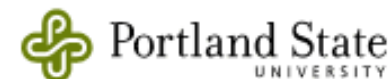
